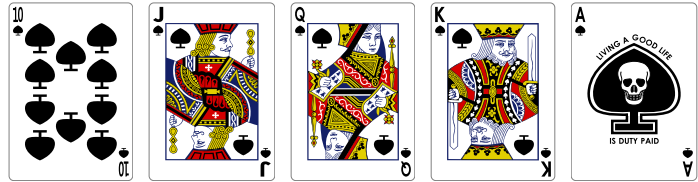


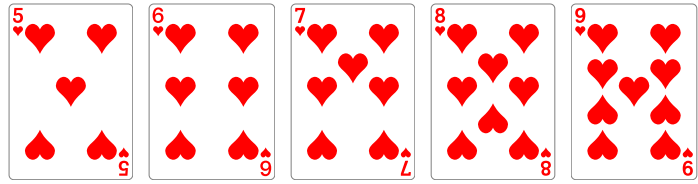
## Royal Flush

The highest possible hand, consisting of the A, K, Q, J, and 10, all of the same suit.



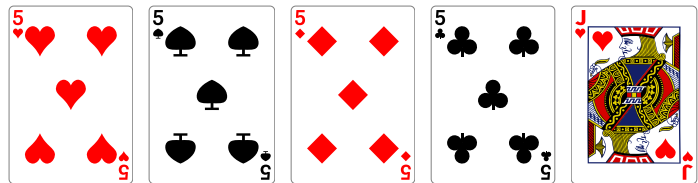
## Straight Flush

Any five consecutive cards of the same suit, but not a Royal Flush. For example, 9-8-7-6-5 all of hearts.



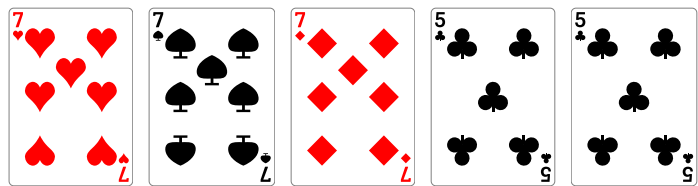
## Four of a Kind

Four cards of the same rank, and one side card or 'kicker'. For example, four aces.



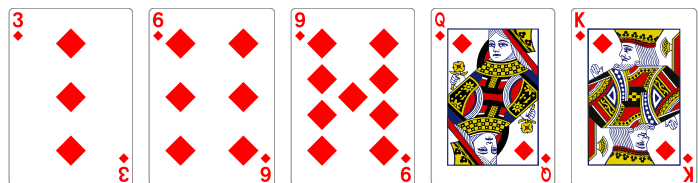
## Full House

Three cards of one rank and two cards of another rank. For example, three 8s and two 4s.



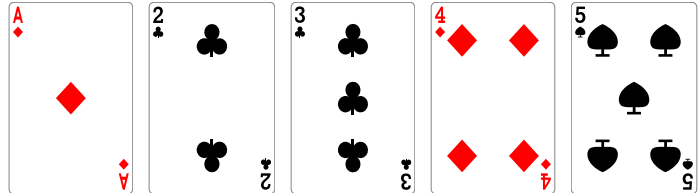
## Flush

Any five cards of the same suit, but not in sequence. For example, K-Q-9-6-3 all of diamonds.



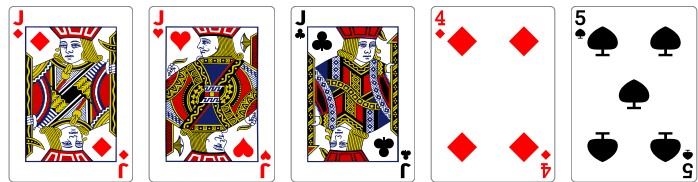
## Straight

Five consecutive cards of different suits. Aces can count as either a high or a low card. For example, 5-4-3-2-A.



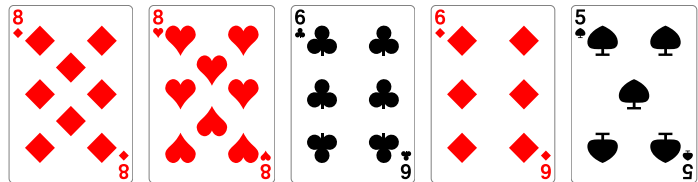
## Three of a Kind

Three cards of the same rank, and two unrelated side cards. For example, three jacks.



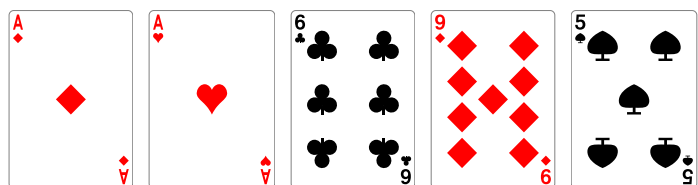
## Two Pair

Two different pairs, and one side card. For example, two 8s and two 6s.



## One Pair

Two cards of the same rank, and three unrelated side cards. For example, two aces.



## High Card

If no one has any of the above hands, the player with the highest card wins.
